

**TOWN OF RAYMOND  
BYLAW NO. 1071-19**

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF RAYMOND IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO  
AUTHORIZE VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS TO USE FLASHING GREEN LIGHTS IN  
THEIR VEHICLES

WHEREAS, Section 28.2 of the Traffic Safety Act, being Alberta Regulation 122/2009 with amendments up to and including Alberta Regulation 31/2012 and amendments thereto, gives municipalities the power to pass a bylaw allowing full time and volunteer firefighters to use flashing green lights in their vehicles as a means of identification;

NOW THEREFORE, the Town of Raymond in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled enacts as follows:

**Citation**

1. This bylaw may be cited as the “Green Light Bylaw.”

**Provisions**

2. A full time or volunteer firefighter may carry on or in a vehicle, other than an emergency vehicle, a lamp that produces intermittent flashes of green light and may operate the lamp in the Town of Raymond if the vehicle is proceeding to a fire or other emergency.
3. No person other than a full time or volunteer firefighter shall operate a lamp that produces intermittent flashes of green light.
4. Nothing in this Bylaw shall be construed so as to permit a full time or volunteer firefighter to operate a vehicle in contravention of the Traffic Safety Act, any other provincial legislation or regulation, or any Bylaw of the Town of Raymond.
5. This Bylaw shall come into force and effect upon the final passing thereof.

**Severability Clause**

6. If any portion of this bylaw is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the invalid portion must be severed, and the remainder of the bylaw is deemed valid.

This bylaw will come into force on the date of third and final reading.

**READ** a first time this 19th day of March 2019

**READ** a second time this 2nd day of April 2019.

**READ** a third time this 2nd day of April 2019.

This bylaw will come into effect upon third and final reading.
